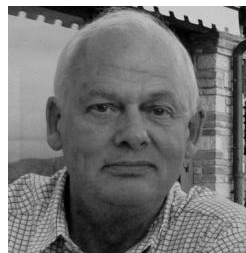

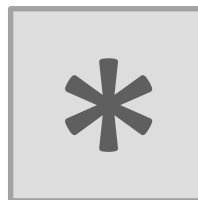

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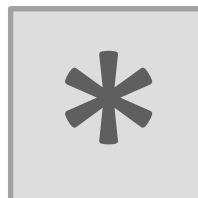

Around 75% of Walford parish lies within the boundary of the Wye Valley Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty. The area was designated in 1971 and so this year is the 40th anniversary of its establishment.

During this 40th birthday year a special series of 4 free celebration events has been arranged focussing on the themes of hidden industry, viewpoints, river connections and hill forts.

Events at Tintern and Symonds Yat took place in April and May and the 3rd event, 'On the Way to the Wye', was recently held in Ross, the only town within the WVAONB area. This celebrated the Georgian era during which Ross-on-Wye emerged as the gateway to the Wye Valley and the Wye Tour became an important tourist attraction. Many visitors, including artists, poets and writers, came to the town and surrounding area and the Picturesque movement began. The final event in the series entitled 'Mediaeval Mayhem' will be held at Chepstow Castle on 18th September

The Wye Valley AONB unit in Monmouth is responsible for the administration of the AONB and it arranges events and walks in the AONB area which are advertised in its 'Wye So Special' leaflet and 'Picturesque' Newsletter. In addition publications are regularly issued giving information about the attractions and self guided walks within the area. The most recently published, 'Walk this Wye', describes a selection of 12 walks accessible by public transport

If you're interested you can volunteer to help the unit with the conservation tasks or events and activities regularly held each year throughout the AONB area

A report from our new Rights of Way officer

As the newly appointed Rights of Way Officer for Walford, I would firstly like to thank Mike Downey for his years of hard work on the never ending cycle of maintenance and clearance.



I have held this post in the past, and was happy to take up the reins again when Michael stood down, as I have a working knowledge of much of the network within the Parish. However, I have a full time job and have limited time available to check our Rights of Way, especially footpaths on the 'flatlands' and Chase Hill, between our 'southern hills' and the Ross town network.

Within Walford we have approximately 25.7 miles of Rights of Way. With such an extensive network I would be very grateful for any help that is on offer.. If you walk or ride in our Parish, & feel that a path or track is becoming overgrown or blocked, PLEASE report it, either directly to me, or through our Parish Clerk. If it is a definitive Right of Way, then it is our duty to keep it open. However, if you are willing, it would be very much appreciated if individuals trim the occasional overhanging bramble, or suchlike, as they pass. It all helps.

Presently we have ongoing funding to help with maintenance from Hereford Council, in an agreement called The Parish Paths Partnership. This money is not meant to be used to cut hedges that overhang Rights of Way - this is the landowner's responsibility in most cases, and the co-operation of landowners within the Parish is essential and much appreciated. Hedges grow outwards very quickly!

A good proportion of our parish is within the WVAONB, with the Wye Valley Walk route passing through as well. I believe that we are very lucky to have so many paths & tracks to share - please enjoy & appreciate!

Recreational Field for Walford Parish

Since our last report the project has moved slightly forward – there was a survey carried out which was attached to the last newsletter and we have had 30 replies. Although it was disappointing that so few did respond, it was nice to see that some people did and to see their reaction and thoughts to help us with this project.

When this committee was first formed, we looked at 18 different areas within Walford where we felt we could create this facility. But through process of elimination i.e.: suitability, we were left with the one site that would be suitable for such a facility.

The following data was as a result of the survey replies and we have based our facts and figures on the those responses.

Overall, from those 30 who responded – there was interest in the village having a centre and that centre be one of activity. We feel very positive at this juncture and are now planning to seek further advice and guidance on how to progress this work through to the next stage.

Once we have confirmation that our proposals are achievable it is my intention to hold a public meeting and involve the residents of Walford Parish in full discussions and planning for the project going forward. However, we are a long way off from that work yet, but you will be getting updates regularly via this publication and also the Parish Council Minutes where you will be able to see how we are progressing.

We have met with the land owner – who at this moment is open minded with this project and has offered support and advice as he can.

We are currently working on CAD drawings of the site and once they are of a suitable standard they will be submitted to the land offices in Worcester who will advise if we could potentially change the use of the site from agricultural to recreational use and what that will entail. Until we have that detail we will not be in a position to progress the project further.

However, work in progress continues, data is being collected around use, funding and costs. We are also looking into maintenance, sustainability, resources and management as well as revenue. We continue to visit sites in other counties to gather information on how such facilities work and what steps we would need to take to ensure viability and the pleasure and safety of all users.

Updates to on-going projects

Walford Links Cycleway and footpath project

There is not a great deal of additional information to report since the Spring Newsletter. However, progress is gradually being made. Councillor Philip Heath has had a meeting with Hereford Council regarding the project and he reports that due diligence is complete and costings are now being prepared.

There has also been some activity with regard to what the project might have to find in terms of funding.

Hereford Council Rights of Way department are in the process of looking into how to go about establishing the Rights of Way needed for this sort of venture, but it is understandably a slow process, and as such one with which patience is required.

We hope to have more significant information to share in the Autumn Newsletter.

The Village Warden Scheme

Ward Councillor Jarvis has raised this subject with the new 'Health and Well-being' board, made up of a consortia of GP's, the PCT and the Council. The concept was endorsed at the meeting and we can now move ahead with a view to implementing the plan.

There is a need and the scope for the third sector to be involved; the reasoning is that funding is tight in the current climate and so the parties involved are looking at the best way to bring the project forward from a funding point of view.

Superfast Broadband for Herefordshire

There is currently a bidding round taking place, involving the big players in the industry, such as BT, Virgin Media and Sky, for the contract to supply Superfast Broadband to South Herefordshire.

Due to earlier efforts, Kerne Bridge Ward is perfectly placed to become a key site when Phase 1 is implemented.

Now that the elections are out of the way, work on the business plan for Kerne Bridge continues, guided by the advice on promoting tourism responsibly in an AONB.

St Michael and All Angels Church - Walford

This is situated at the same sharp corner of the B4234 as Walford Court, with the Walford war memorial behind its protective barrier and the lime trees forming the Road of Remembrance (for the WWI casualties – one tree was planted for each man killed) leading up to the church and forming one side of the churchyard. The church is presently dedicated to St. Michael and All Angels, having been St. Leonard's until the major refurbishment of 1887. There are two interesting pictures inside the church by the main doorway which show the inside of the church before this refurbishment. Feel free to come and look!

Walford is now in the same 'ecclesiastical' parish as St. Mary's Ross, (under Rev. Sarah Jones) having been in the Kerne Bridge Group of Churches (Walford with St. John's, Howle Hill, Bishopswood, Goodrich, Marstow and Welsh Bicknor) until about ten years ago. St. John's and Welsh Bicknor churches have closed, but the others are still going, merely grouped differently. Rev. Owen Williams, who was priest-in-charge of Walford for seven years, retired last October, and at present there is no-one particularly for Walford, although it is hoped to appoint someone on a "house-for-duty" basis this autumn.

The present pattern of services is 9.30am Holy Communion first Sunday in the month, 9.30am Matins second Sunday in the month, 6.30pm (in the summer, 3.30pm in winter) Evensong on the third Sunday in the month, 9.30am All Age Communion on the fourth, and Communion with Healing also at 9.30am on any fifth Sunday that occurs. A notice is normally up on the notice-board near the entrance gates if you wish to check. Everyone is very welcome.

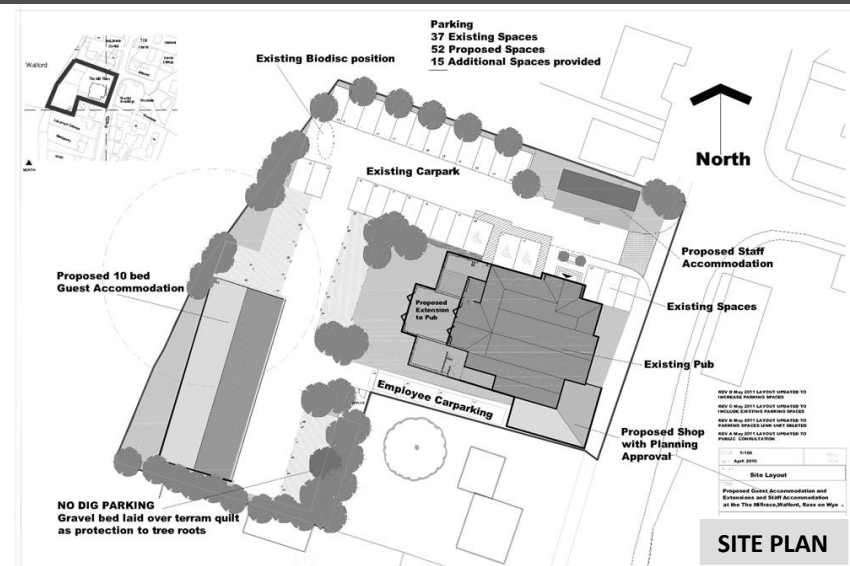

All Saints Church - Bishopswood

All Saint's Church Bishopswood has played a central role in the community since it was endowed in 1841. The church is a simple building, hidden in the trees to the East of the main B4234 Ross-on-Wye to Coleford road. Constructed of the green stone from the Forest of Dean it is known locally as "The Church in the Woods".

Planning - The Mill Race Pub development proposals



Following the obligatory Public consultation held by the applicant at the Mill Race, the Parish Council held a public meeting on Tuesday 31st May, at which the applicant and his Agent made a presentation and held an open question and answer session with members of the public and the Parish Council.

As a result of the public consultation and subsequent meeting of the Parish Council, the proposals for the development were amended by the applicant, in order to address the concerns expressed by local people regarding the original plans.

The rationale for the development was explained by the owner as follows:

"In order to ensure the survival of the Mill Race in an ever changing marketplace we have put in a planning application which includes some staff accommodation and some guest bedrooms. The Mill Race provides a meeting point for everyone in the village and surrounding area and we are looking to secure the long term future of this facility by diversifying the business to ensure that it remains commercially viable and the guest rooms will provide a necessary income stream.

Many pubs such as this one in rural locations have closed because it is no longer viable to operate as a business. We are hoping that the planning application will continue to receive local support. We have already obtained planning consent for a village shop / delicatessen on the front of the pub and we would be looking to develop this as part of the proposals."

The Parish Council hold a view that a viable local Pub is an important part of the community and having considered the revised plans, the public and the Parish Council were prepared to support the application.

Some thoughts from our new Community Officer

Your Present Council has now gone one stage further in appointing a 'Community Officer' whose responsibility will be to promote opportunities to meet your council members enabling them to represent your views in council and forward to District Council if deemed necessary. I am sure that we are all appreciative of our wonderful locality and our community with a wish to either enhance parts of it or retain parts as we deem fit. This needs a positive united front via your Parish Council to promote community views.

As your Community officer my first task has been to initiate an opportunity to meet socially your recently elected parish councillors. Four venues a year corresponding to the issue of the News letter are envisaged and these are tentatively in place. I shall attempt to contact further venue opportunities with a view to spreading them about the parish as best possible, thus enabling all to visit a local venue near to you but please travel to all venues if possible and meet your neighbours and councillors.

Attendance at the average PC monthly meeting has not generally been encouraging for your councillors who do put in many hours of their time on your behalf. It would buck them up no end if they saw that their community was appreciative. Your local views as to traffic, highways, footpaths and planning issues etc, are necessary, enhancement is possible, councillors cannot be expected to know all aspects and it's too late or difficult to amend these once a decision has been made without your possibly well informed experience of the situation.

I look forward to seeing you at the forth coming "meet your council" venues. The first of which will be at Bishopswood Village Hall on Saturday morning between 10.00 am and 12.00 noon on the 23rd of July, tea and a little extra will be available for you to hold onto whilst socialising, have fun and do get involved.

Police report from June PC meeting

A new Chief Constable has been appointed and there will be dramatic structural and political changes on the way, probably after 1st September; however, Community Officers are being funded for the next 2 years.

'Operation Wingspan' has been a great success, mainly due to information gleaned from the Public; it has resulted in successful drug busts and one handgun has been taken off the streets. The Police thank members of the Public, who supplied useful information.

There has been success in dealing with scrap metal dealers, the Police have been stopping and checking that they hold licenses, please ask to see the license of any scrap metal dealer who calls round.

There have been reports of thefts from sheds locally, which are generally insecure; please make sure that your sheds are secure and that particularly valuable items are kept in lock up garages.

Cars are being broken into in beauty spots, usually because items are left on display; please make sure that items of value are out of sight when you leave your vehicle.

VOLUNTEER DRIVERS NEEDED



Community Transport Schemes operate in every parish in the county and rely on volunteer drivers to provide transport for local people, who often have no other means of getting about. With local bus services under threat due to cuts in local authority funding, it is important that community transport providers have the resources to meet the increasing demand for their services.

If you are a good driver and have some time to spare, even if it's only a couple of hours a week, then you could make a big difference to someone's life in your community. You could either drive your own car, for which you would receive a mileage allowance to reimburse your running costs, or a minibus or smaller vehicle owned by the scheme. Journeys are usually made within Herefordshire, but schemes may also take people further afield eg for hospital appointments.
